Students in the 4th Grade will participate daily in learning activities relating to math, ELAR, science, social studies, and religion. Co-curricular activities throughout the week include physical education (twice a week), Discovery Lab – coding and robotics (twice a week), Spanish (twice a week), and library (once a week). Additionally, students will choose a fine art co-curricular they will attend 4 days a week. Options include visual art, band, or orchestra.

plots. The second half of the year will consist of topics covering measurement, area and perimeter, decimals, adding and subtraction of decimals, multiplication and division of decimals, angles, lines and shapes, and properties of cuboids.
