## **Grade Level: Kindergarten**

Students in Kindergarten will participate daily in learning activities relating to math, ELAR (handwriting, reading, phonics), science, and religion. Religion on Fridays consists of attending Mass as a school community and takes the place of in-class religion instruction. Co-curricular activities throughout the week include visual art (twice a week), music (twice a week), physical education (twice a week), Discovery Lab – coding and robotics (twice a week), Spanish (twice a week), and library (once a week).

Students will be introduced to concepts through logical sequencing, with lessons encouraging discussion and helping students reach fluency through engaging activities and strategies. Corresponding exercises in workbooks help students consolidate and practice new knowledge. During the first half of the year, students will cover topics of match, sort, and classify, numbers to 10, shapes and solids, compare height, length, weight, and capacity, and comparing numbers within 10. The second half of the year will consist of topics covering numbers to 20, number bonds, addition, subtraction, numbers to 100, time, and money.

real-world applications. Throughout the Kindergarten year, students will explore materials and motion, trees and weather, and animals two by two.

The theology lessons students will experience throughout the year will focus on weaving in age-appropriate catechetical learning relating to salvation history, Christian anthropology, heroic virtue and character formation, and learning through discipleship. Groundwork for understanding the dignity of the human person is provided, and lessons will help prepare students for a deeper understanding of our faith in later grades. As part of the CGS experience, students will also experience entering the mystery of the Eucharist through hands-on, Spirit-led learning in the Atrium.
